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Giving up driving

Having to give up driving is not easy because access to a car provides independence and mobility, especially as we are in a rural area. You may have decided yourself that you are no longer safe to drive, or you may have been told by your doctor. This leaflet is here to help you with information and how to find alternative transport.

Why do I need to stop driving?

Any professional that tells you to stop driving would have thought long and hard before doing this. They only advise you to stop driving if they are certain that it is no longer safe for you to drive.

They may have also referred you for a driving assessment. It is important you do not drive until the assessment is complete and you have been told it is safe for you to drive again.

As a general guide it may be time to give up driving if:

- You feel less confident about driving than you used to.
- You get lost on roads that you know well.
- Your reactions are slower than they used to be.
- Your eyesight is getting worse.
- You have had a number of near misses lately.
- Your passengers are concerned about your driving.
- You have a medical problem that might affect your driving.

If I have been told I need a driving assessment, what are my next steps?

You will be referred to the Driving and Mobility Centre, which will send you a form to complete. Once you have sent this back, they will book an appointment for you. The current wait is about four months for an appointment.

On the day of the assessment the appointment will take about 3 hours and will consist of:

- paper-based task,
- basic physical assessment
- simple vision tests
- a driving assessment.
